#### Comparative adjectives





To make comparative adjectives, we normally add -er or -r.

This table is cheaper than that table. It's nicer than those over there.

For adjectives ending in consonant + -y, we delete -y and add -ier.

William is funny but Eric is funnier than William.

For adjectives with two or more syllables, we put **more** before the adjective. These new chairs are **more comfortable** than the old chairs.

The opposite of **more** is **less**. We use **less** in the same way as **more**. This sofa is **less comfortable** than that sofa.

The two most common adjectives that have irregular comparatives are **good** and **bad**.

Ryan is good at football, but Olly is **better** than Ryan. Ryan is **worse** at football.







#### Superlative adjectives



To make superlative adjectives, we normally add **-est** or **-st**. For adjectives with two or more syllables, we put **the most** before the adjective.

I like French and Geography, but History is **the most interesting** subject.

The opposite of **the most** is **the least**. We use **the least** in the same way as **the most**.

All the lamps are expensive, but this one is **the least expensive**.

The two most common adjectives that have irregular superlatives are **good** and **bad**.

Olly is **the best** at football. Ryan is **the worst** at football.

#### The Age of the Dinosaurs

Everyone knows that the dinosaurs lived a long, long time ago. They were all dead 65 million years ago. But how long did they live on our planet? The answer is: a *very long time*! In fact, they were on Earth for about 170 million years. That's much, much longer than modern people!

There were lots of different dinosaurs. Some dinosaurs were very big, like the Argentinosaurus. It was the biggest dinosaur, about meters long. The heaviest dinosaur was the Brachiosaurus. It was the same as 17 elephants. The Microraptor was only 40 centimeters long and it lived in China. The most intelligent dinosaur was the Troodon. It was about two meters long.

What about dinosaur eggs? Scientists sometimes find dinosaur egg fossils. They are harder than chicken eggs and usually bigger. But some scientists found three centimeter-long dinosaur eggs in Africa. They were smaller than a chicken's egg.

Some people think the dinosaurs are the scariest animals ever. What do you think?
