Today we will review and practice using Present Perfect and Past Simple verb tenses.

But first, who is this?

That's right! It's Mr. Bean!

Do you want to watch a Mr. Bean video?

Of course you do!



Let's watch!

Do you want to watch a Mr Bean Video?

Of course you do!

Remember *Where* Mr. Bean is and *what* he does (actions)



Let's watch!

A: Yes, he has.

Q: Have you ever played golf?

A: Yes, I have / No, I haven't (have not).



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A: Yes, he has.


Q: Have you ever played golf?

What verb tense is this? It's present perfect.

When are we talking about?






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Q: Have you ever played golf?

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When are we talking about? Mr. Bean's whole life until now.


A: Yes, he has.

Q: Have you ever played golf?

When are we talking about? Mr. Bean's whole life until now.

Do we know exactly when he played golf?


A: Yes, he has.

Q: Have you ever played golf?

A: Yes, I have / No, I haven't (have not).







When are we talking about? Mr. Bean's whole life until now.

Do we know exactly when he played golf? No, we don't.

It's not important, we just want to know if he has played golf or not.


Let's look at another example:

Q: Has Mr. Bean ever been on a bus?

A: Yes, he has.

Q: Have you ever been on a bus?

A: Yes, I have /No, I haven't (have not).



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How can we make a question?

Have/has + subject + ever + past participle (verb 3) + object



Let's look at another example:

Q: Has Mr. Bean ever been on a bus?

A: Yes, he has.

How can we make a question?

Have/has + subject + ever + past participle (verb 3) + object

How can we answer?

Yes, subject + have/has

No, subject + haven't / hasn't (have not / has not)

How can we make a question?

Have/has + subject + ever + past participle (verb 3) + object



How can we answer?

Yes, subject + have/has

No, subject + haven't / hasn't (have not / has not)

We know Mr. Bean has been on a bus.

We want to know more.

What can we ask?

More questions!

How can we find out more information?



More questions!

Where did he go?


When did he take the bus?

Who did he go with?

What colour was the bus?

Why did he take a bus?

How did he feel?



More questions! What verb tense is this?

Where did he go? He went to the shop.

When did he take the bus? He took the bus in the afternoon.

Who did he go with? He **went** alone.

What colour was the bus? The bus **was** yellow and green.

Why did he take a bus? He **wanted** to get his golf ball.

<u>How</u> did he feel? He **felt** worried because his ball **was** on the bus.

What verb tense is this? More questions!

Where did he go? He went to the shop.

That's correct, it's past simple When did he take the bus? He **took** the bus in the afternoon.

Who did he go with? He **went** alone.

What colour was the bus? The bus **was** yellow and green.

Why did he take a bus? He wanted to get his golf ball.

He **felt** worried because his ball **was** on the bus. **How** did he feel?

Example (positive):

Subject +	have/has	Past participle (verb 3)	object
I/you/we	have	travelled	to another
He/she/it	has		country

Example (negative):

Subject +	have/has +	not +	past participle + (verb 3)	object
l/you/we	have	not (haven't)	travelled	to another country before
He/she/it	has	not (hasn't)



How many did you hear? Well done!


