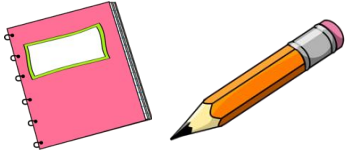

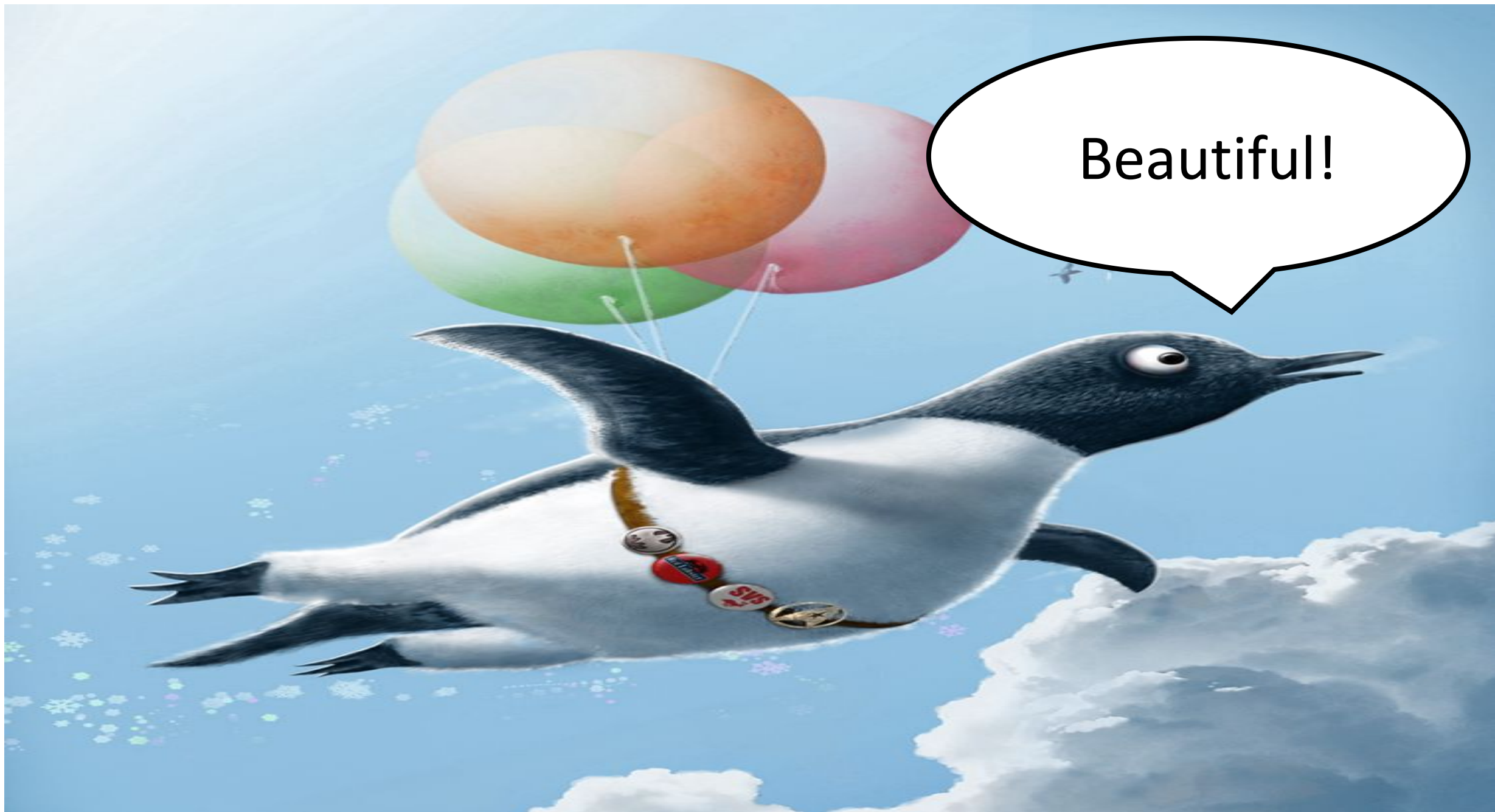
I believe I can fly,

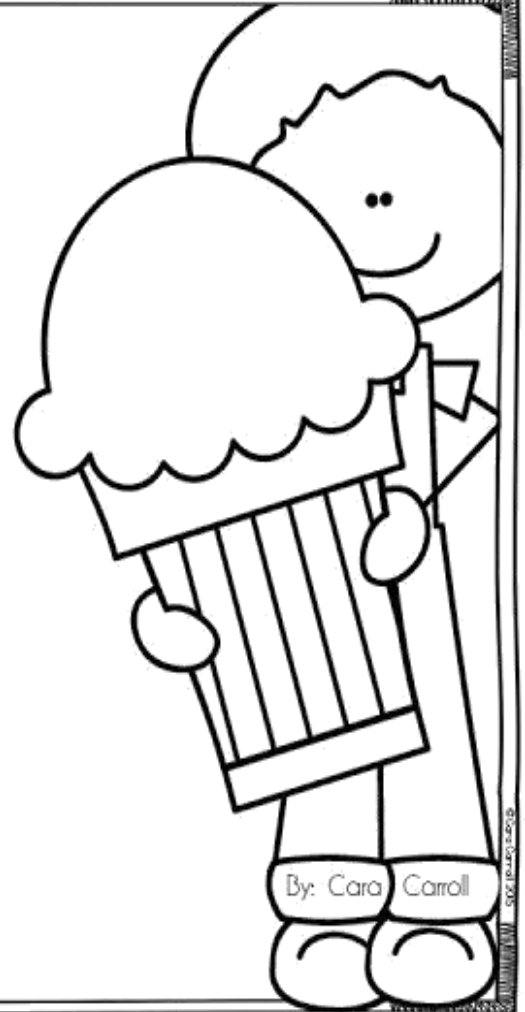
